GRADE 7 ELECTIVE COURSES

PLEASE NOTE: ELECTIVES ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE DEPENDENT UPON STAFFING AND STUDENT INTEREST

Art 7 – This program introduces the student to a variety of media such as painting, sculpture, drawing and printmaking. The major components of the course are:

1. Creating - students will be introduced to various media. Techniques include ways to shade, create a variety of line, texture and add volume. In painting, students learn about how to work with and create colour. In sculpture students are introduced to clay and wire design.
2. Compositions - students are introduced to ways images are put together to create meaning by studying the elements of art and design.
3. Encounters with Art - where we meet and discuss current and past artwork and how we respond to visual imagery.

Tentative fee: \$22.75

Band 7 (Full Year) - Learn to play a musical instrument, read music, make friends, be a part of a team, and have fun in this hands-on course. Prior musical training is not required. Your music education will not be limited to one style or instrument as the music varies from traditional band music to pop and movie music. Students may have opportunities to take part in activities such as band camp, band trips, and clinic days. Students will be expected to take part in public performances and festivals as they occur. Band instrument choices include woodwind, brass, or percussion instrument. There are instruments available for rent at the school or students may provide their own approved instrument.

Tentative fee: \$35.00

Instrument rental: \$75.00

Communication Technology 7 (Computers) – An Introduction to computer coding. Students will be introduced to the basics of computer coding in the HTML, CSS, and JavaScript languages (the foundation languages that are used to build websites). Students will also be introduced to icon-based coding through the use of MIT's Scratch platform and through a number of assignments using the Lego EV3 Mindstorms robots and the associated programming software. Please note that the foundations of this course are based in peer-based constructivism where they are expected to learn from each other as they problem-solve and advance their knowledge base.

Tentative fee: \$11.00

Drama 7 – Lights, curtain, action! Students will explore movement, speech, improvisation/acting, technical theatre, and theatre studies. They'll develop confidence and learn about themselves and others. Students will write, rehearse, and perform various types of projects, such as choreography, lip syncing, storytelling, puppetry, sketch writing, and theatre sports. This is a great opportunity to flex your creativity and collaborate with your friends. Please note: this is a performance based class.

Tentative fee: \$12

French 7 (Full Year) – Those students who are interested in pursuing a second language and who would **love** to have countless **advantages in the future** should consider taking French 7. The four skills needed for successful communication (reading, writing, listening, and speaking) are all practiced in class through a variety of activities, assignments, projects, and a novel study. Students who may be planning to attend a University following High School should consider taking French throughout their Junior High and High School years.

Hockey Plus 7 (Full Year) – This course is designed to allow grade 7 students to gain a greater appreciation for hockey. Students will learn sportsmanship and will enhance their skating and stick handling skills through scrimmage games. Students will have ice time at the Sportsplex from October to May. They will also be able to play against the teachers in our annual Raven Cup. When ice time is not available, students will have the opportunity to participate in and explore a variety of other recreational sporting activities. These activities may include golf, slow-pitch, basketball, football, ball hockey and cooperative games. Personal equipment is required (helmet with cage, gloves, elbow pads, skates, and hockey stick).

Tentative fee: \$50.00

Math Strategies 7 - This course has two important aims: (1) to build mathematical mindset and confidence and (2) to improve mathematical skills and achievement for students struggling in mathematics. This course is designed as an intervention to target missing knowledge, address misconceptions, and re-establish confidence in mathematics for these students. Students in this course will receive individualized, student-centred instruction, resources, and time to further develop foundational mathematics concepts so they can be successful in meeting curriculum requirements for their grade.

Performing Arts 7—Calling all cast and crew! Are you interested in a course that will allow you to be a part of our school's major drama productions? Then this is the class for you! Whether you enjoy being onstage or staying behind the scenes, this is your opportunity to be involved in the action from the ground up. You will not only act, but also design various elements of the show, and help with the construction. This course is for highly motivated individuals, who wish to pursue theatre at the highest level. Performing Arts is the perfect steppingstone to high school drama. Please note: this is a script-based performance class and some extracurricular rehearsals will be required

Tentative fee: \$22.25

Sports Acceleration 7— This course is designed to allow Grade 7 students the opportunity to deepen their knowledge of the cross-training that is required to perform as an elite athlete. Students will enhance their muscular and cardiovascular endurance with a variety of demanding workouts that will eventually be tailored to each student's desired sport of focus. Students will be expected to push themselves regularly and will be expected to achieve during numerous scheduled fitness tests.

Tentative fee: \$50.00

Wildlife 7 – This course focuses on the Alberta Conservation and Hunter Education program, which is a Provincial requirement for all first-time hunters in Alberta. Created and delivered by the Alberta Hunter Education and Instructors' Association (AHEIA), under legislation by the Alberta Government, students will develop knowledge, skills and attitudes related to the conservation and responsible use of wildlife. The program includes: Role of the Hunter, Hunting Ethics, Wildlife Management & Conservation, Wildlife Identification, Clothing & Equipment, Firearms, Bow Hunting, Survival, Field Techniques, First Aid, Hypothermia, Legal Responsibilities. In addition to module work, there will be many hands on activities relating to archery, survival skills, and field trips related to wildlife identification. Students may choose to get their Hunter's Certification at the end of the course.

Tentative fee: \$5.50

Certification tentative test fee: \$27.25
